NOTES (A) On this checklist, year-long courses are divided into two semesters.

(B) Shorecrest requires 22.5 credits to graduate (15 credits in required courses and 7.5 credits in elective courses). A student must also satisfy the "Other Graduation Requirements" listed above.

(C) When a requirement has been met, any other course passed in that subject area is counted as an elective.

¹ The Fine Arts Requirement can be met by passing Art or Music classes - or - by passing Visual Tech, Photo, or Video Production classes in the CTE Department, or Drama classes in English.

² The Occupational Requirement may be satisfied by taking Business Tech/Marketing, Family & Consumer Science, Industrial Tech, or Visual Tech courses in the CTE Department.

³ Washington State History is often satisfied in middle school. If a student did **not** pass this course, he/she must take a Government or Senior Civics course.

CHECKLIST FOR FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE PLANNING

If you plan to attend a Washington State four-year public college or university the fall after you graduate from Shorecrest, you need to plan for the following college admission requirements while you are in high school:

ENGLISH	four years or eight semester classes
MATHEMATICS	three years or six semester classes (through at least Integrated Math 3),
MATHEMATICS SR. YEAR	one year or two semesters of a math-based quantitative course in the senior year - does not require a 4th year of math
SCIENCE	two years or four semester classes; both must be lab and one must be algebra-based biology, chemistry, or physics
SOCIAL STUDIES	three years or six semester classes
WORLD LANGUAGE	two years or four semester classes (in the same world language)
VISUAL/PERFORMING ARTS	one year or two semester classes (or an additional CADR credit)

Additionally, in order to be considered for admission to a Washington State four-year public college or university, students in the graduating class of 2012 and beyond must earn a minimum of three credits in CADR courses each year of high school, including their senior year. See additional information about CADRS, and the Senior Year math requirement, in the Shorecrest Registration Guide.

NOTE: These are the minimum high-school course pattern requirements for public baccalaureate institutions in the State of Washington - some have more specific requirements. See the Shorecrest Registration Guide for more information. Requirements for private and out-of-state institutions vary, and may exceed these requirements. Check information from these individual institutions.
